

# The 'Seeway Trust Ghana'

**In the last three years, the Seeway Trust has become involved with two orphanage Homes in Ghana and from these, other projects are now in the process of being established.**

## **The Seeway Trust Ghana**

'Seeway Trust Ghana' is being formed under the leadership of Rev Dr James Mensah who is the leader of Elim Church in that country. It will be a Non Governmental Organisation (NGO) and will work together with 'Seeway Trust UK', in order to provide the aims of Seeway Trust in Ghana and will oversee all the projects in that country.



## **Bawjiase**

'The Countryside Children's Welfare Home', Bawjiase, Central Region, was started about 20 years ago by a lady called Emma who is now married to Capt Joe Yeboah.

When Seeway Trust came into partnership with The Countryside Children's Home there was 62 children living there. There was no regular finance coming into the home, no fresh water, food was supplied by one off gifts from local churches and organisations, there were many times when the larder was empty.

Seeway Trust began a sponsorship scheme for individual children and are now sending monthly finance to the home. Other local organisations are still helping with one off gifts and projects. Over the time that we have been working with the home we have seen great improvements. There is fresh water supplied through a main and also a bore hole on site. Capt Joe has utilised the land and much food is now grown on the site.

The Seeway Trust is in the process of building a school here, to educate children from the home and local children.

At this time there are 114 children at the home aged from new born babies to 18 years old.
